Overview and objectives

In Liberia, civil society presence and efficiency outside Monrovia is weak. Through this programme, Forum Civ (a Swedish non-profit) is establishing a network of partner civil society organisations (CSOs) and working to strengthen CSOs across three focus areas:

- Governance and accountability;
- Gender equality; and
- Environmental sustainability.

This means supporting CSOs working directly on these substantive areas as well <u>as promoting good practices</u> in these areas more generally.

The programme's objective is that: "civil society organisations have developed and strengthened their presence in rural counties in Liberia through increased capacity of rights-holders living under marginalised conditions to claim their rights and participate in locally owned initiatives and local development processes." The outcomes targeted are:

- Partner organisations and communities have developed their capacity to participate in decisionmaking processes regarding the three focus areas.
- Partner organisations have developed their advocacy and monitoring skills of governmental institutions, public service providers and private sector actors' performance, across the three areas.
- Partner organisations and CSO networks have the capacity to develop, fund-raise and implement
 projects of their own choice that are linked to needs identified by the involved rights-holders and
 communities; and informal grassroots groups have transitioned transitioned

Activities

Forum-Civ supports partner organisations, primarily small rural Civil Society Organisations, to implement local projects. Embedded in the support is a capacity building intervention is designed to includeing coaching and training of CSO leaders, and organisational development. Forum-Civ works with organisations to develop the policies and systems (e.g., administration, finance) needed to strengthen the organisation, and supports CSO project planning and monitoring. Through the programme, financial and technical assistance is also provided to the partner CSOs.

In addition to the individual CSO level support, Forum-Civ also works to create networks and connections between CSOs to strengthen the civil society ecosystem, for example, collaborating with CSOs to pursue the new Land Rights Law in Liberia.
